Instructions for the Attu Virtual Staff Ride (VSR) Preliminary Study and Organization

Overview

These instructions are designed to help participants prepare for the Attu VSR. The preliminary study phase provides participants a thorough understanding of the historical event *prior to* the field phase. In other words, to maximize the learning experience, the participants should already know 'what happened.' Preliminary study can include reading materials, classroom sessions, movies, and any other material that can be presented before one conducts the field phase. For this staff ride, the preliminary study phase is primarily provided in the read ahead materials and other options referenced in this package. The preliminary study phase is critical to the success of the field study phase and therefore equally critical to the success of the staff ride as a whole.

Preliminary Study Guidance.
